Dear Friends in Christ,

I love Mormons (I hope you do too!). I decided to tour the LDS temple just up the road. I took the tour because I wanted to be able to better relate to Mormons. I was also interested in how their beliefs would be presented. Every word was intentional and polished! They obviously had the process down from the initial video to the friendly workers posted at every corner, even children who assisted putting on shoe covers.

As for the temple itself, they clearly spared no expense on building materials—lots of doors and high ceilings. The baptismal font (used for proxy baptisms for the dead) was described in the most compassionate of terms. The idea of sealing marriages for eternity was presented as necessary for forever families. I walked through several instruction rooms where other deeper teachings are revealed to actual temple goers. (In earlier versions of these films, Protestant ministers were portrayed as agents of Satan.) The celestial room was, well, a room with a fancy chandelier. Supposedly, it is a place to feel closer to God and ponder life.

It was noteworthy as to what I did not see. I saw perhaps seven portraits of Jesus but none of Joseph Smith. No mention of secret handshakes, secret names—the things the Joseph Smith carried over from the Masonic Lodge. No mention that Mormon men believe they can become gods themselves and from the celestial kingdom call their wife/wives to them. There was certainly no mention of the fact that today only about 10-15% of LDS members can enter a temple once it is dedicated. The reason? The remaining 85-90% are not temple worthy. They haven't done enough to deserve it.

The open house period is now over and they have ripped out all the carpet that we "unworthy" people have touched. As an expensive gesture, they have installed new carpet to prove a point—holiness and worthiness go together.

I still maintain the LDS church is the best church that man could ever build. That is its virtue and problem. The LDS temple itself is more about man's supposed progression to God, than God's descent to man. That's a red flag to me. In the Bible, temples are more about God providing a way to encounter Himself and be righted in relationship to Him.

Consider how when the Word became flesh, God "tabernacled" among us in Christ (John 1:14). At the crucifixion, the temple curtain was torn from top to bottom (Mark 15:38). Christ referred to His body as a temple that would be torn down and rebuilt in three days (John 2:19). Paul tells us our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 3:16). And in heaven, there is no temple for the Lord God and the Lamb are the temple (Rev. 21:22).

This is great theology, but to what effect? It means we can always cherish and trust more what God does and has done than whatever fancy thing man thinks of, even if it appears to be quite beautiful and holy. It is Advent—and soon Christmas—which means God has done some real tabernacling on our behalf. Both our holiness and worthiness are found only in Him.

From Pastor Tom's Pen

I don't know if you have had the experience of being disconnected by distance, profession, or for some other reason from someone for a long time. With our relatives we usually connect yearly or more if the distance is great. Our relatives are mostly in northwestern Ohio, Indiana and Michigan. Many have gone to glory to be with Jesus; so that we don't go back every year. In recent years some of you have met a Confirmation classmate by the name of Rick who has visited us at Friendship Celebration several times a year. Rick and I have connected a number of times over the years, but I had a new experience this past week. I reconnected with BILL.

Bill lives in Marsing. We have talked a couple of times on the phone in the past few of years, but have not seen one another face to face until last Monday, November 13, 2017. It is the first time we have seen one another face to face in over 52 years. We tried to do this before, but it didn't work out. This time we were very specific. He told me what he would be driving and wearing and I did the same. We graduated together from Concordia High School in Milwaukee. Wisconsin. There were only about 100 of us and we lived together in the same dormitory for four years. We all had our close friends, but after four years you were close to all your classmates. We are both 70, and I thought we spent a significant percentage of our lives, which shaped us to be what we are today together, with our teachers and mentors in high school.

So, what did we talk about? Of course, I can't "tell all," but I couldn't believe how our values, spiritual lives, work ethic, interests, and pastimes are so similar. We have prayed at church for Bill's son who was in a special forces unit in Iraq. I didn't realize it was his son at the beginning. His grandchild came to our preschool, I didn't realize it at the time. We had a fantastic time reconnecting over lunch and talked about 104 years of our lives. I don't know how often that happens. We plan to continue this relationship of reconnecting. Bill and his wife are connected with another LCMS (Lutheran) church in the Treasure Valley, but I hope he and family might visit us every once in a while.

So, all of this brings up the age old Lutheran question: "WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?" All of us have had the experience of reconnecting with someone we haven't seen for a while. I hope for most of us it has been good. I also believe that for us as Christians there are no accidental meetings. I believe that in the present – our day to day experiences and connections – God puts people in our path. My experience with Bill and others like him shows me that God reconnects me with people in my past. I'm convinced He has a reason.

So...here's the challenge I have for you. This is a great time of the year to make some kind of effort to reconnect in a relationship that has gone on "hold" for some time. We can sign and send a card or we can make an effort to make a personal contact. E-mails and texts are fine, but, in my opinion, there is nothing like a personal phone call.

What do you talk about? That's up to you. Suggestion: personal history, family, past and present interests, politics – carefully, goals and plans for the future, spiritual things as the Holy Spirit guides you. Don't be afraid to be risky. What have you got to lose if you haven't been in touch for a while? You are already taking the risk by taking the initiative.

The challenge of following Jesus means that we strive to be like Him in all our relationships. I don't think Jesus unfriended anyone.

As part of our efforts to keep you informed regarding financial matters of Friendship Celebration Lutheran Church, we will be providing a breakdown of the payments made on our outstanding loans on a quarterly basis. For the period January 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017, we have paid regular payments of \$70,200 on our LCEF Mortgage as follows:

Principal paid \$34,694.92 Interest paid \$35,505.08

Principal of \$4,050, above and beyond our regular monthly payments, has been paid by contributions received specifically to reduce our overall debt. Thanks to all those who have contributed for this purpose.

Our outstanding balance on the LCEF Mortgage as of September 30, 2017 is \$1,199,873.50.
