In May, Pastor Tom, Brett and I attended DiscipleShift training in Post Falls at Real Life Church. It was time well spent and I'm glad we went as a team. It affirmed for me that we are on the right path—whether it's a new church plant in Kuna or a way of refocusing our efforts at Friendship Celebration, discipling is the actual mission of the church.


The kind people we were staying with in Post Falls were actually in the process of building another house. I couldn't help but think we were building a type of house as well—something that we wanted to endure and withstand the elements.

We all came back from Post Falls encouraged and ready to take the next steps. We decided we needed to be modeling this personally and so we're starting with us. It's not enough to talk about it. We have to put it into practice ourselves. As they cautioned us, "Don't go home and try to change the church. Change you!"

That behavioral change is key. What is the difference between the man who built his house on the rock and the man who built his house on the sand (see Matt. 7:24-27)? Both were believers. Both admired Jesus and agreed with His teachings. But only the wise man acted by doing the word. Jesus does not speak only to be heard, not even to only be believed. He speaks in order to be obeyed. Unless we get to the point of actual obedience, learning and transformation has not occurred. In a similar way, Scripture tells us to "be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." (James 1:22). So we know what Bible study is. But what about Bible do-y? If we truly do what the Bible says to do, we'll make disciples.

The good news is that every believer by virtue of the Holy Spirit has the capacity to be discipled and make disciples; it's in our spiritual DNA as a result of being baptized. But it's something that needs to be brought out and developed. Discipleship is intentional and relational. It won't happen on its own.

On Saturday, August 11, we'll have discipleship training as a way of replicating our DiscipleShift experience with folks who are also interested in discipling others. By then I bet Pastor Tom, Brett and I will be able to share with you key learnings that we will have learned as a result of putting it into practice.

# **Bubbler or Maxi-Paw?**

Are you a bubbler or a Rainbird Maxi-Paw? I'll explain the difference, but first I have to share a little about my garden this year.

This year I have a little greenhouse. It was a gift from two families in our church. They helped me put it together. It is 6' x 8' and is plenty big for the plants in my garden. I am getting ready to plant squash, cucumbers, and tomatoes. My potatoes, onions, beans, peas, and corn are already up. With the plants in my greenhouse I've decided that I need to expand my garden a bit and that means an additional row of sprinklers. I put in eight new sprinkler heads. Bubblers are heads which just water one or two plants. I put in the next size which are called shrub heads. They covered a little more territory, but not nearly of the area I needed to be watered. If I needed to go 15-20 in every direction, I needed a sprinkler head called a Maxi-Paw. I have all the water I need, but I needed sprinklers that would distribute the water to where it needed to go to reach the plants that need the water. By the, way, I love trying to figure this out!

So back to the question above with additional adjective: Are you a "spiritual" bubbler or a Maxi-Paw? Just imagine the water being the Holy Spirit and His potential power working through the sprinkler head in your life. All the power that is needed for the issues that come up in your life is available through the Holy Spirit. Here are possible issues: doubts about God, the Bible or your faith, frustration with the organized church, legalistic attitude, impure thoughts, guilt, worry, a critical spirit, aimlessness – not knowing where you fit into God's plan, loss of love for others, poor prayer life, or no desire to read the Bible and apply it to life.

First of all, realize that you are not alone. Most, if not all, Christians struggle in the process of growing as a Christian. Remember that if you realize that you are a sinner, and that Jesus Christ paid for your sins on the cross, your POSITION with God is secure. You are His child. However, our spiritual CONDITION is always in process. The Holy Spirit not only brings us to a saving knowledge and trust in Jesus as Savior, He makes us aware of where we need to grow in that relationship with God and others. The Holy Spirit is the source of overflowing life. All the power to be a Maxi-Paw Christian is available to us. (John 7:37-39). The Holy Spirit has come to glorify Jesus through our lives. (John 16:1-15). Jesus promised the power of the Holy Spirit to enable us to be witnesses for Him. (Acts 1:1-9).

So how do I turn on the full power of the Holy Spirit with the issues in life that I struggle with right now? How do I change from a bubbler Christian to a Maxi-Paw? I believe it starts with the desire to want to be directed and empowered by the Holy Spirit. (Matthew 5:6; John 7:37-39). Confess or admit to God and YOURSELF where you have tried to control your life and the issues of life, and believe the promise that He has forgiven you. (Colossians 2:13-15; 1 John1, 2-1-3) And give (again and again) every area of your life to God. (Romans 12:1-2).

God has told us to be filled with the Holy Spirit, and He has promised to hear our prayers. "This is the confidence we have in approaching God, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears, and if we know that He hears us – whatever we ask – we know that we have what we asked of Him." (1 John 5:14-15).

It is important not to depend on feelings. The promise comes from God's Word, not our feelings. That's the authority and where the MAXIMUM power comes from. The growing Christian lives by faith in the trustworthiness of God and His word.

As some of you may know, I was born with a progressive genetic disorder called Neurofibromatosis and have been diagnosed with NF-1

Neurofibromatosis (NF) is a progressive genetic disorder of the nervous system which causes tumors to form on nerves anywhere on the body and can lead to blindness, bone abnormalities, cancer, deafness, disfigurement, and learning disabilities. This disorder affects all races, all ethnic groups, and both sexes equally. NF-1 is one of the most common genetic disorders in the United States (one in every 3,000 births). At this time, there is no cure, nor are there any effective treatment options.

Multiple times a year, I travel with my family to the Primary Children's Hospital NF Clinic in SLC Utah to monitor my NF. I have many tumors throughout my body, and they recently have been monitoring a 5" tumor along the side of my spine through MRI's
