



# **Pastoral Ponderings**

I recently went skiing with the kiddos up at Bogus Basin. And no, David Banker was not there this time, but we still had an enjoyable day. I think my favorite part of skiing might be the ski lift because it provides such a tranquil and reflective moment. The scenery of the mountains and forest is beautiful and—as an added bonus—I usually get to see a few people wipe out below and I feel better about my mediocre skiing ability.

What caught my eye this time was something as simple as a pine tree, laden with pine cones. Maybe it was the perspective of seeing it from top to bottom, but I was just amazed at how many pine cones could come from one tree—thousands! And I thought, wow, this is one tree that is set on reproducing!

Life comes from life—that's what the law of biogenesis says anyway. A basic law of nature is that living things reproduce according to their own kind. Trees make trees. Fish make fish. And disciples make disciples, right? When it comes to spiritual reproduction, the same God who created the world has designed disciples to multiply themselves. The God-given potential is there; the spiritual DNA is given in our baptisms when we are born again as children of God.

Surprisingly and significantly, Jesus—while still having "all nations" (Mt. 28:20) in mind—does not put forward a large-scale approach when it comes to making disciples. Sure, Jesus taught the crowds, preached the gospel and wowed them with miracles, but He never discipled the crowds. His actual discipleship was only done in the "smalls." Why is that? Because we can only disciple people who are in a meaningful relationship with us; that requires time, proximity, influence. These are limited commodities as we all know. So Jesus gives a large scale mandate, but it can only be accomplished by thinking and acting in the smalls.

At the discipleship training in January, we learned how discipleship is the intentional investing of the life of Jesus into the life of another. It is a sharing of life together in the journey of following Jesus. It's about helping people grow and get to the point where they can help others grow and so on. It takes time and commitment but the result is changed lives for both people! You may be in need of someone to disciple you. Or you may be ready to disciple another person or group of people. Either way, discipleship is what we were made for!

So let me return to that pine tree, laden with pinecones. Apparently, it can take several years for pinecones to fully mature. The tree "knows" it's a process. That's why it has pinecones at different stages of development at the same time. Well, if the tree could represent the church, then its pinecones are people who are also in process and full of relational potential. They have life within them because it's been given them.

The God-given principles of growth and reproduction are not contained to the natural realm, but abound in the supernatural realm as well. Make disciples...who make disciples. That's how forests are made. That's how life works.

# How You CAN Put Your Worries To Work for You

Do you have issues with worry? My mother sure did. She worried about her older brothers when or if they would ever come home from their Saturday nights out. Then there was World War II. My father was in the infantry in the invasion of North Africa and she didn't hear from him for weeks at a time. Her brother, Ray was an MIA and then became a POW. Another brother-in-law was killed in action. Mom worried about just anything you could imagine in my growing up and adult years. The problem was transference. Mom transferred that worry to me and my brothers. Yes, she did have reason to worry about us from a human standpoint. We were worse than all her nine brothers and dad combined, but over and over again we told her to turn us over to God: "Let Go and Let God!" And THEN we became parents and discovered what worry is when it comes to our own children.

Experts tell us there are two kinds of worry: a negative, harmful, crippling worry and a positive, beneficial concern. Negative worry is an anxiety that focuses our thoughts on things we can do nothing about or on matters that distract us from resting on God's ability to meet our needs. Jesus conveyed in the Sermon on the Mount that He wants us to trust Him one day at a time.

The Bible does speaks of a healthy concern that results in meaningful action and prayer. So how do we put our worries to work for us? First of all: **LET WORRY TURN OUR ATTENTION TO GOD**. Nothing happens in this world that is beyond the knowledge and power of God. We need to acknowledge the truth that we are inadequate to meet the demands of life in our own strength. We need to remind ourselves that God is everywhere, He knows everything, and He is all-powerful. The cares of this life that weigh so heavily upon us need to be placed on the shoulders of Jesus. He is more concerned about our children, health, work, friends and our nation than we are. In our sinful, broken world, we have no guarantees except that God can be trusted. He desires that we draw on His grace and mercy in every circumstance that He gives or allows.

Secondly, **LET WORRY TURN OUR ATTENTION TOWARD JESUS**. Jesus understands our inclinations and He reminds us that just like the natural world, we were not made to worry. Birds have to eat, but they don't get migraines obsessing about it. Flowers "wear clothes" but they don't have to be treated for ulcers. We worry about food and clothing, competing and about controlling the future, instead of concentrating on what is most important. Jesus said: "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added to you." Matthew 6:33 Are we worried about work, family, health, security? These are all real issues. But in the presence of Jesus, they become less threatening.

Thirdly, **TURN WORRY INTO PRAYER**. Few of us have encountered the kind of problems that the Apostle Paul endured. Yet he simply wrote: "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, let your requests be made known to God, and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7 When we trust God with our cares, we can thank Him for being the kind of God who loves us, understands our problems, and has the power to answer our prayers.

Finally, A PRACTICAL APPROACH TO WORRY. The Apostle Peter wrote: "Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you." 1 Peter 5:6-7 We need to accept what we cannot change. Instead of emotionally unraveling or avoiding reality by denying our worry, we can humbly accept that these circumstances are a part of our lives. We need to have an appropriate sense of who we are as God's children, and be willing to accept as much or as little as God gives us in the present moment. You and I alone know whether or not we have been practicing reliance on Jesus or trying to carry a heavy burden on our own. I struggle with worry about so many things. A friend often reminds me: "Don't borrow trouble!" We alone know what we need to bring to our Lord and Savior and leave it with Him.

Let God have a grip on your worry!
